



**WORK PROCESSES:**

The apprentice shall receive on the job instruction and experience as is necessary to become a qualified journey-level worker versed in the theory and practice of the occupation covered by these Standards. The following is a condensed schedule of work experience, which every apprentice shall follow as closely as conditions will permit.

Employers/training agents shall only use registered apprentices to perform the work processes as stated in this section. (WAC 296-05-003 - Definitions)

**The processes in which the apprentice shall be trained are as shown in the work processes schedule.**

**The apprentice shall also perform other duties in the shop and on the job as are commonly related to such apprenticeship.**

<u>Residential Carpenter:</u>	
1. <u>Form Building</u> .....	400
<i>Build and place straight concrete forms, irregular concrete forms, concrete forms for stairways and floors.</i>	
2. <u>Rough Framing</u> .....	2,000
<i>Floor, wall, roof, stairs.</i>	
3. <u>Outside Finishing</u> .....	1,200
<i>Application of cornice and wall trim. Set door and window frames. Application of all exterior finishes and related trim.</i>	
4. <u>Inside Finishing</u> .....	1,500
<i>Application of door and window trim. Fit and sand doors and windows. Application of baseboards and moldings. Construction and setting cases, closets and stairwork. Flooring.</i>	
5. <u>Hardware Fitting</u> .....	300
<i>Application of hardware fittings to exterior and interior of buildings, doors and windows.</i>	
6. <u>Layout</u> .....	1,500
<i>Batter boards, partitions, doors and windows, box-out in concrete walls, roof.</i>	
7. <u>Care and safe use of tools and woodworking machinery</u> , .....	500
<i>including: Cross cut and rip saws, circular saws, pneumatic nailers and staplers, powder actuated tools, etc.</i>	
8. <u>Miscellaneous</u> .....	600
